


Table 1. Noncontiguous states, which include Hawaii and Alaska, have the highest Thanksgiving meal prices, with Hawaii coming in at about 21 percent over the national average.

Table 2. The most affordable states to buy ingredients for a Thanksgiving meal are Georgia and Kansas, which ring up approximately 12 percent lower than the national average.








Figure 3. The centerpiece of many Thanksgiving tables comes with a higher price tag this year. The national average cost of a 16-lb turkey weighs in at \$33.63 or \$2.10 per pound. While the price might seem high compared to previous years, turkey remains a more affordable protein option. According to Jayson Lusk, distinguished professor of agricultural economics and director of the Center for Food Demand Analysis and Sustainability (CFDAS), turkey prices will likely fall closer to Thanksgiving as shoppers take advantage of discounted prices at stores.






Figure 4. Organic shoppers will likely pay about 50 percent more for their organic turkey in comparison to non-organic turkey. The national average cost of an organic bird is \$50.63 or \$3.16 per pound.






Figure 5. If you're planning a meatless holiday meal, we also included the national average cost of enough tofu to make a stuffed "tofu turkey" for 12 people. At \$3.20 per pound, vegetarian protein is the most expensive protein option per pound. But since it takes only 6 pounds to feed 12, the total price for protein in a vegetarian meal is lower.
