"Introduction to Applied General Equilibrium Analysis in a Multi-Region Framework"

The <u>Center for Global Trade Analysis</u>, in the <u>Department of Agricultural Economics</u>, recently held the <u>25th Annual Short</u> <u>Course in Global Economic Analysis</u> from July 15-20, 2017 on the campus of Purdue University.

The Annual Short Course in Global Trade Analysis is a long-standing, educational offering by the Center for Global Trade Analysis which aims to introduce participants to a standardized framework for conducting global policy analysis in an applied general equilibrium setting; to provide participants with ample hands-on training with software that has been tailored to global economic analysis; and to give participants the opportunity to interact with economists working on global trade and resource use issues while becoming part of the international GTAP Network. In total, 25 individuals from 13 different countries representing government offices, international agencies, the private sector, and academia participated in this course.
