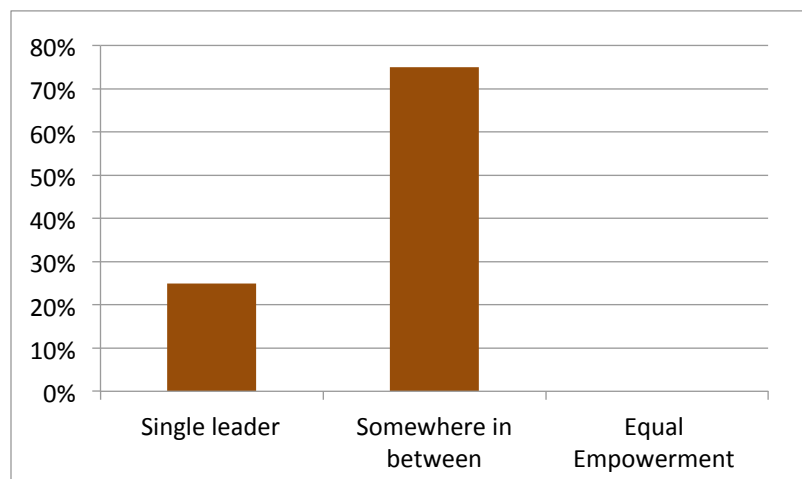
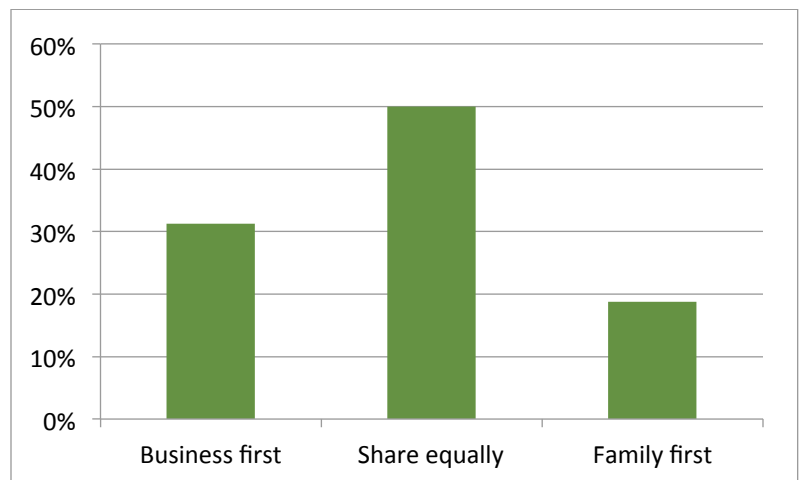
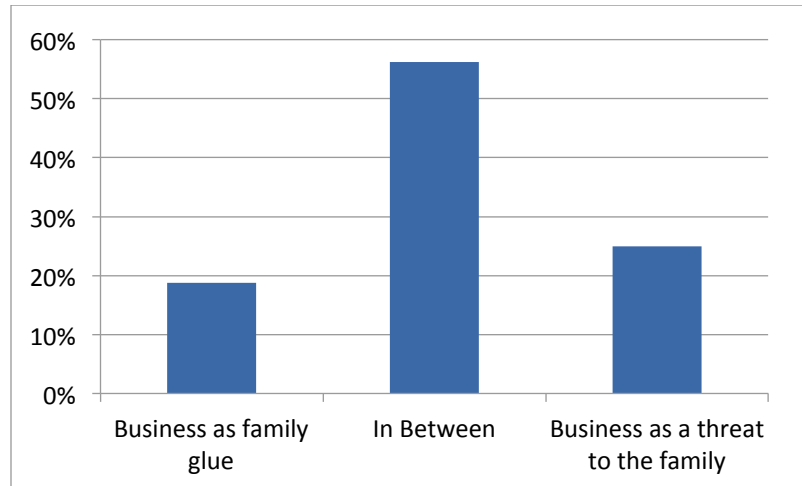


How Do YOU View Your Family Business? This is how business owners responded.
