Pre-Veterinary Medicine



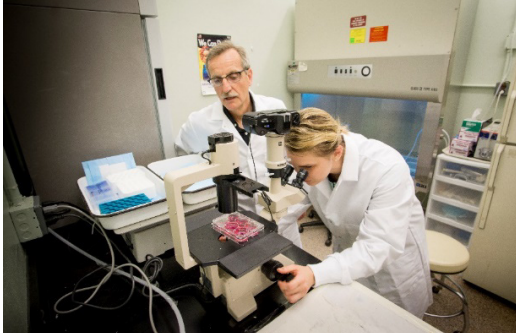
- For students who are seeking careers in research or technical animal services

Research



- Student research assistants develop hands-on lab skills, participate in research projects, discover future professions, and learn more about diverse species and subjects while working side by side with faculty/staff and graduate students
- Potentially earn credit toward your degree or receive an hourly wage

Animal Sciences Research and Education Center (ASREC)



- Student workers receive valuable work experiences alongside professionals and other students
- Other possibilities include assisting faculty and staff with livestock research
- Units include: aquaculture, beef, dairy, farm and feed operations, poultry, sheep, and swine

Study Abroad



- Over 400 trips ranging from 10 days to 6+ months through the College of Agriculture
- ANSC trips include: Produzioni Animali: Exploring Animal Production in Italy, Animal/Food Security: International Service Learning in Laos, Kafakumba Training Center in Zambia, and Food Security and Environmental Challenges in Vietnam
