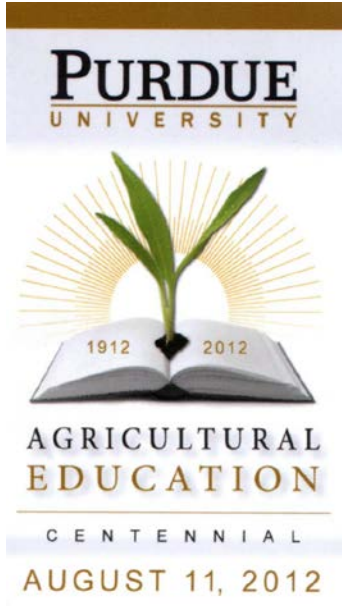

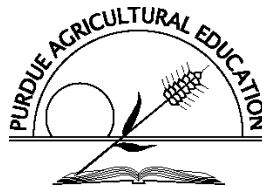

IDOE Welcomes New Agricultural Education Specialist

In May 2011, Chris Kaufman was selected as Indiana's new Agricultural Education Specialist at the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE). He received his B.S. in Agricultural Economics, Sales and Marketing, and Agricultural Education from Purdue University and an M.S. in Educational Administration from Ball State University. Chris has taught Science at Lynhurst 7th and 8th Grade Center, Agricultural Education at Whiteland Community High School and schools in Florida.

Kaufman's responsibilities within the IDOE's Office of College and Career Preparation include managing, revising, and creating agricultural education content and curriculum around the state as well as expanding the rigor and relevance of agricultural education with the STEM disciplines of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Dr. Levon Esters was recognized by the American Association for Agricultural Education (AAAE) North Central Region as its 2010 Outstanding Early Career Agricultural Educator. Dr. Esters with the assistance of Megan Anderson (YDAE graduate student) and Kayla Mosson (Agricultural Education undergraduate student) is working on a number of marketing strategies for the Advanced Life Sciences (ALS) program. The major initiatives currently underway include updated ALS brochures and posters which are now available as well as an ALS website that should be up and running in mid-December.

Drs. Allen Talbert and Levon Esters co-led the Maymester Study Abroad in Jamaica for 15 Agricultural Education undergraduate students. This was the sixth and largest group to participate. Jamaica's College of Agriculture, Science and Education (CASE) and Purdue's College of Agriculture now have a Letter of Agreement to develop additional collaborations.

Combined with the five named endowments, there is now \$361,000 generating scholarship support for Agricultural Education students. 2011 Agricultural Alumni Certificate of Distinction

The Ag Alumni Association presented its highest honor, the Certificate of Distinction, to agricultural leaders during the Ag Alumni Fish Fry at the Indianapolis State Fairgrounds on February 6, 2011. Among the honorees were the following Agricultural Education graduates.

Byron Ernest graduated from Purdue in 1985 with a B.S. in Agricultural Education and Animal Science. He earned an M.S. in Agricultural Education in 1987, also from Purdue. He has spent the last 25 years in education and is currently working on a Ph.D. in Teacher Leadership from Walden University.

After graduation, Ernest taught for four years, and then spent four years with the Indiana Department of Education as a Vocational Education Specialist. From 1993 to 1994 he served as executive director of the National Young Farmer Educational Association at the U.S. Department of Education in Washington, DC. He returned to Indiana and spent ten years as the agriculture instructor and department head at Clinton Central, where he coached 21 state winning leadership contestants and won numerous state and national awards. Since 2004 Ernest has been an agriculture instructor, FFA advisor, and department head at Lebanon High School.

Ernest has been honored for his professional achievements on many levels. He was Indiana Teacher of the Year in 2010, the first agricultural science teacher ever so honored. During the past year, Ernest's other awards include: Smithsonian Teacher Ambassador, SMART Exemplary Educator, and the Christopher Columbus Fellowship Foundation's Outstanding Agriscience Teacher.

W. Scott Rumble retired in 2002 from a 32-year career with Purdue Extension Service. Rumble graduated with an A.S. from Vincennes University and a B.S. from Purdue in 1969, majoring in Agricultural Education. In 1975 he earned his M.A. from the University of Louisville. He worked in six different counties, serving at various times as a 4-H Youth Educator, County Extension Director, Interim District Director, Ag and Natural Resources Educator, and Community and Economic Development Educator. His last Extension post was in Tippecanoe County.

During Rumble's tenure in Extension he brought high profile leaders from around the state to mentor or share advice with farmers, 4-Hers, and Master Gardeners. He established good networking relationships among farmers, 4-H families, and government officials. In Tippecanoe County, he is credited with improving the county fair, the 4-H program, and the community environment.

The National County Agents Association has honored Rumble with its Superior Service Award for Youth Development, the Achievement Award, and its Distinguished Service Award. He has also received awards from the Tippecanoe County Port Producers and the Indiana Extension Educators Association. In 2002 he was honored as a Distinguished Hoosier by the Indiana General Assembly, and he was named a Sagamore of the Wabash by Indiana Governor Frank O'Bannon.

Butcher Fellowship

Through the generosity of Dale and Toni Butcher and friends, a fellowship endowment has been established to provide financial assistance for practicing agricultural science and business teachers to professionalize their teaching license or pursue graduate degrees at Purdue University. The 2011 Butcher Fellowship recipient is Gabe Nobbe. Gabe is an agricultural science and business teacher at Connersville High School. He is in the YDAE Master of Science program. He has served IAAE District 9 as its representative to the Indiana FFA Board of Trustees.

Necrology Report

Over the past year we have lost several former agricultural science and business teachers. The following are those who have passed away this year. Please contact us if you know of others that have passed on this year.

Thenard A. Torgerson, 94, died Tuesday, March 1, 2011. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin at River Falls. He later earned a Master of Science Degree from Ball State University. Mr. Torgerson taught vocational agriculture and science forty years. He started teaching at Jefferson Township Schools at Upland and Matthews, Indiana. After World War II he taught at Sweetser High School and Oak Hill High School in Grant County, retiring in 1980. During his years as an Ag teacher, Mr. Torgerson worked with FFA students and had many successful judging teams. He was active in Grant County 4-H and could often be seen taking pictures of 4-H students with their projects.

Jerry L. Boyer, 74, passed away on Sunday, March 13, 2011. He earned a bachelor's degree from Purdue University and a master's degree from Ball State University. Mr. Boyer taught high school agriculture classes thirty-eight years (all in Huntington County) and served as FFA advisor for twenty-two years. He was a certified Indiana Master Gardener.

Gordon D. Logan, 72, died Thursday, March 17, 2011. Mr. Logan graduated from Purdue University with bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural education. He taught vocational agriculture at Lakeville and Rossville High Schools, and retired from Clinton Prairie High School after 27 years. Mr. Logan devoted many hours to FFA.

James E. McDonald, 86, passed away Wednesday, August 10, 2011. Upon graduation he joined and served in the U.S. Navy Seabees from 1943 to 1946. After serving his country, he graduated from Purdue University with bachelor's and master's degrees. Mr. McDonald was a lifelong educator. He taught at Western High School for 18 years and Lewis Cass High School for 19 years. While at Lewis Cass High School, he was in charge of the Coop program and Department Head. He retired from teaching in 1986.

Phillip J. Lindenman, 63, died Sunday, August 21, 2011. He led an active life as a farmer, agricultural consultant, agricultural educator, FFA advisor and 4-H leader. Mr. Lindenman had taught Agricultural Sciences at Argos High School for 4 years. Then he worked for Farm Bureau and developed an agricultural consulting business. He later returned to teaching agriculture related classes at Northwood High School for 15 years. Mr. Lindenman graduated from Purdue University with a dual degree in Agricultural Education and Agronomy. He later received a master's degree in agricultural education. He retired from Northwood High School in July 2010.

Nelson Parkhurst, 97, passed away Wednesday, August 24, 2011. He received a B.S. in 1938 and an M.S. in 1943 from Purdue University. He served in the Army from 1943 to 1945. Mr. Parkhurst taught vocational agriculture at Morristown High School from 1938 to 1941 and was assistant food service manager at Purdue Memorial Union from 1941 to 1942. He then taught vocational agriculture at Jackson Township School from 1942 to 1943. Hired by Purdue University as assistant registrar and director of admissions in 1946, Mr. Parkhurst was name registrar and secretary of faculties in 1956, retiring in 1980. He was a member and past chairman of Indiana Student Assistance Commission, past president of the Indiana Association of College Registrars and Admissions Officers, and past president of American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers. In 1982 he was named a Sagamore of the Wabash by Gov. Otis Bowen.

Everett L. McCauley, 92 died Saturday, September 24, 2011. Everett received a bachelor's degree from Purdue University in 1941 (where he was also involved with ROTC for two years), a pre-med degree from Berkley University in California in 1945, and also master's degrees in industrial arts and school administration from Ball State University. A teacher for thirty-nine and a half years, he taught agriculture and sciences at Cutler for two and half years before going into the navy and another six months there after the war. For thirty-five years he taught agriculture and sciences at Connersville High School and was also a critic teacher at Purdue University for ten years. He served as a 4-H leader for many years and received the American Farmers Degree. Everett had twelve American Farmers under his teaching and 286 students received their Hoosier Farmer Degree under his direction. He was inducted into the Retired Teachers Hall of Fame for the Fayette County School System.
