From Curiosities to Conservation: Exploring Research and Wildlife Insights Through Museum Collections

Natural history collections' evolution from "cabinets of curiosities" to premiere institutions focused on research and education has expanded the breadth of scientific questions addressed by museum scientists. Although specimen-based systematics and taxonomy remain fundamental to these institutions, research topics range from disease discovery to conservation practice. The Field Museum's Collections, Conservation, and Research (CCR) Division is no exception; with researchers in the Gantz Family Collection Center (GFCC), Keller Science Action Center, and Negaunee Integrative Research Center working on a wide variety of topics. As Collection Manager of Mammals in the GFCC, I have had the opportunity to work on projects strongly tied to my background in wildlife management. This talk focuses on a subset of those projects, including: small mammal ecology in Chicago's South Side, pathogen discovery form museum specimens, and use of museum specimens for conservation of African small carnivores.
