The U.S. is a global economy, which inherently increases our risk of invasive species. In a perfect world, eradication would be the ultimate goal for every invasive pest in the U.S. – but we all know that's not possible. So, what is possible, what is realistic, and what should be considered successful invasive species management? This depends on the invasive pest in question. Eradication is always the goal for some species but certainly is not feasible for others. In some cases, simply limiting the spread of an invasive species should be considered success. This seminar will explore differing expectations for managing invasive species and discuss several case studies spanning the realm of arthropods, fungi, and plants.
