Tracking Migratory Songbirds to Inform Conservation

Persistent declines in the abundance of migratory birds have led to widespread concern, fueling conservation efforts to reverse declines. However, basic information about the migratory ecology of most songbirds is lacking, hindering effective conservation. Using geolocator data from Nearctic-Neotropical migrants, including golden-winged and blue-winged warblers (Vermivora warblers) collected from across their breeding distributions, I will highlight various ways tracking data can be used to delineate space use across the annual cycle, better understand the movement ecology of migratory birds, and inform conservation strategies for migratory species.
