The Department of Environmental Sciences at the University of North Carolina Wilmington seeks a **full-time lecturer** who will be responsible for **teaching four environmental science courses per semester**. Courses taught may vary over time but will include *Introduction to Environmental Sciences* (EVS 195), *Global Environmental Issues* (EVS 205), and *Career Preparation and Networking in Environmental Sciences* (EVS 295), in person and online. Lecturers also participate in service to the department, college, and the university. This a non-remote position. The candidate will work in a collaborative interdisciplinary academic setting.

Candidates must hold at least a Master of Science or equivalent degree in environmental science or a related discipline by their appointment date. Preference will be given to candidates with expertise teaching at the college level in the scientific and social dimensions of the environmental sciences. Preferred qualifications also include a strong commitment to innovation in teaching. Candidates with previous teaching experience in-person and online are encouraged to apply.

The Department of Environmental Sciences focuses on the relationships among the social, physical, chemical, and biological aspects of the natural and built environments. The department offers an interdisciplinary curriculum, drawing upon the resources of many related fields to provide the rigorous analysis necessary to understand environmental problems and formulate environmentally-sound solutions.
