HLA ALUMNA HONORED AT DISTINGUISHED AG ALUMNI CEREMONY



HLA was delighted to celebrate our own alumna at the Distinguished Agriculture Alumni awards ceremony. **Stacy Haviland** is a 2002 graduate of our Landscape Architecture program who has had an outsized influence on the Landscape Architecture profession in Indiana through her work first with Earth Source, Inc. and now with the City of Fort Wayne, where she ensures climate change impacts are accounted for in accessible and beautiful city developments.

PURDUE-USDA TEAM DEVELOPS FAST-TRACK PROCESS FOR GENETIC IMPROVEMENT OF PLANT TRAITS



Dr. Kranthi Varala's lab and USDA researchers have developed a web-based tool that rapidly identifies regulatory genes affecting plant traits, leveraging large datasets from various plant species. The tool uses machine learning to predict transcription factors involved in traits like seed oil biosynthesis, enabling quicker genetic improvements without extensive experiments. This approach highlights potential for broad application across different crops, enhancing research efficiency and trait optimization for agriculture and biofuel production. This work was recently published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

LA CAREER FAIR A RESOUNDING SUCCESS



The annual landscape architecture career fair was held on February 9 in the South Ballroom of the Purdue Memorial Union. With 42 firms from 13 different states in attendance and over 300 student interviews scheduled, the event was a resounding success. The majority of firm representatives are alumni of the LA program so the event felt like a homecoming celebration.

FREIGHT FARM CONTAINERS ARRIVE AT PURDUE STUDENT FARM



On April 29, two Freight Farm growing containers were delivered and installed at the Purdue Student Farm. Freight Farm growing containers are controlled environment agriculture systems that control all production elements, making it possible to grow produce 365 days a year. They will be used to facilitate teaching, extension, and graduate student research. We thank the generosity of the Overbeck Family Foundation for making this possible.
