- Core out of green complexes (6 inch depth), followed by sand capping and regrassing with new zoysia varieties
- Full bunker renovation across all holes with Capillary Concrete and Bunker Solutions liners
- Tee box renovation and releveling throughout the course

This project will give students an invaluable learning experience that spans the full spectrum of golf course management, from agronomic practices and grow-in procedures to large-scale construction coordination and project execution.
