



Host Organization(s)	Vision On Mission (VOM) is a dynamic non-government organization (NGO) which provides rehabilitation services, empowerment, life skills, and employment skillstraining and development in agriculture and other areas to clients (ex-prisoners) in need of re-integration into society after serving time in prison.
	The organization, which manages a live-in center in East Trinidad, hopes to establish and grow produce, raw materials, and value-added products to sell commercially.

Objectives and Anticipated Results	<ul> <li>The NGO would like to engage in agro-processing to diversify its product mix of fresh produce to include processed foods such as baking flour, using the raw material of root crops and tubers produced in the VOM fields. This initiative will increase the income earning capacity of the NGO, its profitability, and the skill sets for future employment of the clients being served by the NGO.</li> <li>To do this however, they require training in the fundamentals of making baking flour and thus will request training from a volunteer in;</li> <li>Fundamentals of making baking flour from cassava, dasheen and sweet potato</li> <li>Storage and packaging of baking flour</li> <li>Once this training is provided, the members of VOM will be better able to develop value added products from their fresh produce and become profitable and sustainable.</li> </ul>

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## **Project Overview**

Trinidad and Tobago is a two-island country of a diverse population with rich history and culture. As an island nation, it is under the constant mercy of changing climate that is affecting natural resources and agriculture. At present, it is a net food importing country forcing the government to refocus its attention on sustainable agriculture as a part of its 2030 country development strategy. The tropical climate and available natural resources, if used properly, can make the country self-sufficient in vegetables, root crops and some fruits with a provision to export value added products. It is an opportune time for F2F volunteers to engage with agriculture extension officers and farmers to impart knowledge and learn about the culture and endurance of Trinbagonians. The objective of the F2F Trinidad and Tobago Country Program is to improve food and nutrition security through productivity, safety, and profitability as well as strengthening the extension service through capacity building.
