We are excited to welcome you to our 2021 Mandela Washington Fellowship Leadership in Business Institute!

The Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders, the flagship program of the Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI), empowers young leaders from Sub-Saharan Africa through academic coursework, leadership training, mentoring, networking, professional opportunities, and community engagement. Since 2014, the U.S. Department of State has supported nearly 4,400 young leaders from 49 countries across Sub-Saharan Africa to develop their leadership skills and foster connections and collaborations with U.S. professionals. The cohort of Fellows hosted by Purdue University, funded by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), will be part of a group of 700 Mandela Washington Fellows hosted by 26 educational institutions across the United States.

Mandela Washington Fellows come from across Sub-Saharan Africa and represent a broad range of perspectives, identities, backgrounds, and experiences. Fellows must be prepared to respect individual differences they encounter during the Fellowship and engage thoughtfully with their peers, Institute staff, and community members.

The Institute will include sessions that are not directly applicable to all Fellows' current work or positions. This approach is intentional, as the Mandela Washington Fellowship aims to empower Fellows with broad-based knowledge that will help prepare them for leadership beyond their current focal points and professional roles.

This agenda will serve as your weekly schedule for both independent work and for the synchronous activities you will complete with our cohort. *Please note that all activities throughout the Institute are required unless otherwise indicated.*
