Possible Incidents

Examples of human-caused Incidents:

 Aircraft crashes; Oil Pipeline Spill; Bomb threat/detonation; Civil disturbances; Train Derailment; Extended power outages; Arson Fires and Explosions; Hazardous materials releases; Mass casualty events; Terrorism; Search & rescue events; Active shooter; Workplace violence

Note: all incidents in **red** have occurred on campus in the past.



Possible Incidents

Examples of natural disasters:

 Tornado; Limnic Eruption (exploding lake), Earthquake; Severe weather, Avalanche, Excessive Ice and Snow; Flooding, Tsunami.

For All Campus Reporting



The **Purdue Hotline** exists to aid you in reporting concerns anonymously about unethical or illegal behavior. The Hotline is not monitored 24/7. Reports received will be triaged and referred to the appropriate area during regular business hours (Monday - Friday, 8am to 5pm). **If you have an immediate concern, please call 911**.



Basic Concepts:

- Simple
- Redundant
- Quick
- Centralized

The PurdueALERT emergency notification & timely warning system notifies the campus community of a possible safety threat. Individuals should take immediate action and seek further information by all means possible.



PurdueALERT Layers:

Outdoor All-Hazards Emergency

Warning sirens: (Shelter In Place)

Indoor Fire Alarms: (Evacuate)

Text messaging: Purdue University faculty, staff and students may sign up via the Secure Purdue website to receive an emergency notification text message.



PurdueALERT Layers:

Twitter: Use your Twitter X app to push notifications from @purdueemergency to your smartphone.

Desktop Popup Alerts: Alert will be sent to the majority of University classroom & lab computers and display incident information on computers that are logged in.



PurdueALERT Layers:

Alert Beacons: Alert will be sent to the beacons that are installed in large classrooms. Beacons alarm audibly for 10 seconds; flash & text alert will be available for 5 minutes.

<u>Digital Signs</u>: Alert will be sent to over 300 signs around campus.



PurdueALERT Layers:

Email: An email may be sent to all people with a purdue.edu address. Purdue Campus Safety Status page: www.purdue.edu/ea is the focal point of the most complete information in all campus-related emergencies. Includes an embedded @purdueemergency Twitter Feed.

Boiler TV: The Boiler Television
Emergency Alerting System may also
broadcast emergency information.
Local Media: The University works with
the news media, radio, TV,
newspapers, and Internet, to help
spread the word.

Building Fire Alarms

Fire Alarm Horns, Strobes, and Speakers

Must evacuate the building when the fire alarm is sounding.

The department provides several emergency preparedness resources for the campus community, including an Integrated Emergency Management Plan and Building Emergency Plans.

Simulcasts the PurdueALERT text message.



AlertUs Desktop Pop-Up Alert

AlertUs Desktop

"Take over" a Purdue logged in computer and display an alert message.

Clicking the "enter" key to acknowledge receipt (PC) or dismiss (MAC) and return to the normal

screen.





AlertUs Beacons

Wall-Mounted Beacons (large lecture halls)

Alarm for 10 seconds (cannot be muted)

Flash for approximately 5 minutes

Provide incident information (Info available for 5

minutes before it resets)





Digital Signage

Wall, Ceiling, or Pedestal Mounted Displays

Over 200 digital signs around campus will display the ALERT message for approximately ten minutes.



Purdue Email

Purdue Career Account Email

An email may be sent to all purdue.edu email addresses to supplement text message based on the needs of the incident.



Simple Message Inside & Outside

When you hear:

ALL-HAZARDS OUTDOOR WARNING SIRENS:

immediately seek shelter (Shelter In Place) in a safe

location within closest facility

FIRE ALARMS: <u>immediately</u> **evacuate** the building and move to a safe location

In both cases, you should seek additional clarifying information by all possible means--Text, Campus Safety Status Page, TV, radio, email, etc.



Shelter In Place

To immediately shelter inside a campus building:

This course of action may need to be taken during a tornado, an active threat such as a shooting, or a release of major hazardous materials in the outside air.

When you hear the sirens immediately go inside a building to a safe location and use all communication means available to find out more details about the emergency.

Remain in place until police, fire, or other emergency response personnel provide additional guidance or tell you it is safe to leave.



Shelter In Place—Severe Weather

Thunderstorm Warning & Tornado Warning:

Outdoor All-Hazards Warning Sirens will activate (Tornado Warning).

Text, Twitter X, Desktop Popup Alert, BTV EAS, Digital Signs & Alert Beacons will be activated (Text & Twitter X for Thunderstorm Warning).

Immediately go inside a campus building to the lowest level away from exterior doors and windows.



Shelter In Place—Active Threat

Active Threats:

Outdoor All-Hazards Warning Sirens will activate. Normally, all other Purdue ALERT layers will be activated...

Response depends on the type of incident.



Run—If there is an accessible escape path:

Be sure to:

- Have an escape route and plan in mind
- Escape regardless of whether others agree to follow
- Leave your belongings behind
- Help others escape, if possible
- Prevent individuals from entering an area where the active shooter may be
- Keep your hands visible
- Follow the instructions of any police officers
- Do not attempt to move wounded people
- Call 911 when you are safe



Hide—If escape is not possible:

Your hiding place should:

- Be out of the active threat's view
- Provide protection if shots are fired in your direction (i.e., an office with a closed and locked door)
- Not trap you or restrict your options for movement
- To prevent an active threat, such as a shooter from entering your hiding place:
- Lock the door if safely possible
- Blockade the door with heavy furniture



Hide—If escape is not possible:

If the active threat is nearby:

- Lock the door
- Turn off the lights
- Close the blinds
- Silence your mobile devices
- Turn off any source of noise (i.e., radios, televisions)
- Hide behind large items (i.e., cabinets, desks)
- Remain quiet



Fight—If escape and hiding are not possible:

As a last resort, and only when your life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and/or incapacitate the active threat by:

- Acting as aggressively as possible against him/her
- Throwing items and improvising weapons
- Yelling
- Commit to your actions, then act.

Driving in Indiana with a Foreign Driver's License

- Can a foreign national student or visitor operate a car in Indiana?
 - Yes, however....
- To drive in the U.S., you must:
 - Have a valid, unexpired driver's license from your home country AND an International Driving Permit:
 - You are permitted to drive in the U.S. for one year using these two documents.
 - You must carry both documents with you while driving.




Driving in Indiana with an International Driving Permit

- You cannot obtain the International Driving Permit in the U.S.
- > You must obtain one in your home country.
- You may not use any other translation of your license as a substitute for the International Driving Permit.

How to Handle Traffic Accidents

If you are involved in a vehicle crash:

- 1. NEVER leave the scene
- 2. Always carry proper documents (license, registration, and insurance)
- 3. Should or should not call police..?
- 4. Animals...
- 5. If there is injury or over \$1000.00 worth of damage, then it must be reported.



Crimes against Property

1. Theft

- EMPV: Bike / Scooter / Skateboard / Moped
- Electronics: Cell Phone / Computer / Watch / AirPods
- Location Specific: Lounge / Dining Hall / Vehicle / Library

2. Burglary

- Personal Inventory
- Conversation with Roommate(s): Guest Policy
- Being a good neighbor / floormate



Crimes against Property - Continued

- 3. Vandalism / Criminal Mischief
 - Personal Property
 - University Property
 - Arson and All Other Shenanigans / Serious Crime
 - If you see something, Say something



Crimes against Person

- 1. Sexual Assault
- 2. Domestic Battery
- 3. Battery / Assault
- 4. Robbery
- 5. Threats / Intimidation
- 6. Extortion / Blackmailing
- 7. Stalking / Harassment




WHAT I MEANT TO SAY WAS...

 - You should die..!








WHAT I MEANT TO SAY WAS...

 - I will not leave this place until you reconsider






Safety Tips from Purdue Police

- ☐ Trust your instincts. When in doubt, call PUPD (765 494 8221).
- ☐ Do not feel obligated to do anything you do not want to do.
- ☐ Always be aware of your surroundings.
- ☐ Report any suspicious activity or person (911 or non-emergency number).
- ☐ Be aware of blue light emergency telephones (ETS).
- Watch your drinks at all times.
- ☐ Use the buddy system with a friend you trust.
- Avoid connecting with suspicious online profiles.
