Human-animal interaction in Chile is deeply intertwined with the country's cultural, economic, and environmental contexts. In regions like the Lake District and Patagonia, cattle and sheep farming are crucial to the economy. In the Andean region, llamas and alpacas are used for their wool and as pack animals in high-altitude areas. Several organizations and centers in Chile focus on rescuing and rehabilitating injured or orphaned wildlife. These centers often work with species such as the Andean condor, sea lions, and various marine and terrestrial animals. Chile is a popular destination for ecotourism, with numerous opportunities for wildlife watching.
