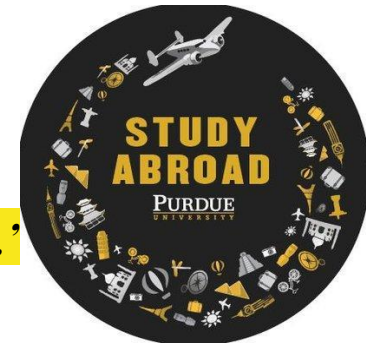

Ayas Community

- Ayas is a Peruvian village with 164 residents and an elevation of 2,311 meters. Ayas is close to the hamlet Eduardo De Habich and the town of Surco.
- Farming community that is said to date back to pre-historic times
- Many farmers live in this community, and they are practice traditional farming practices
- Ayas Community Farm is a part of a larger network of distributors like Vacas Felices who sell their products
