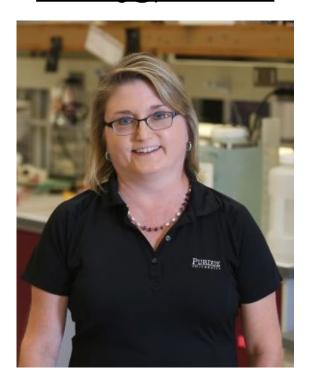

 Bangkok and Chiang Mai are not in the areas of concern for Thailand.

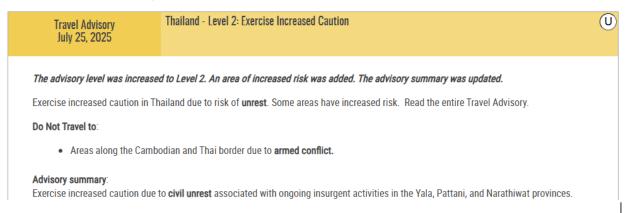
