myPurduePlan (Find in the "Academics" tab in myPurdue): Online degree planning tool; use the "What If?" tab if you want to see what it would look like if you were to add/change a major and/or minor.

Purdue Registrar's YouTube (https://www.youtube.com/@purdueregistrar/videos): These videos show you step by step instructions on how to schedule courses, sign up for a waitlist, etc.

University Core Curriculum (UCC) (https://www.purdue.edu/provost/students/s-initiatives/curriculum/courses.html): Lists of the UCC course options for each category, which are built into all of Purdue majors' plans of study. You need 1 course from each section except for Science; you will need 2 Science courses and 1 Science Technology and Society course. For NRES majors, all of the UCC courses are pre-selected for you except for Humanities (HUM). You can choose your HUM course.
