Thank you for your interest in the **SCARF**. The SCARF Program is for current Purdue undergraduate students in the College of Agriculture to pursue research broadly related to agriculture fields. These fellowships focus on individual research projects under the direction of a faculty research mentor, include a series of science communication workshops designed to give students the tools needed to share their research with others and are available to current undergraduate students. Student who

are scheduled to graduate before the completion of the program can apply, but preference will be given to students who have not graduated. You are encouraged to apply with a specific project and faculty research mentor already selected. Housing is not provided; however, students receive a \$600 initial program stipend to help in securing housing.

Program Details:

- Research is encouraged to be STEM-related
- Program dates for Summer 2022: May 22 – July 28, 2023 (11-weeks, full-time 40 hours/week research experience)
- Participation in science communication workshops, research sessions and SCARF events is required.
- Students are not allowed to take on-campus summer classes, take vacation time, or work additional jobs throughout the program.
- Total Stipend: \$5,400/per student
- Students are responsible for securing their own housing. Residence Hall and off-campus leasing options are available.
- Students are encouraged to secure their own faculty research mentor and determine their research project focus before applying to the program.

- Selection is based on a competitive application and funding availability. The program may accept 15-25 students.
