Program

We will explore China and Japan, two of the largest oriental cultures and also major US agricultural exporting markets. We will visit the US Embassy, agricultural fields, US business executives, Chinese and Japanese farmers, entrepreneurs, and university. We will be in Beijing touring the Forbidden City, and the Great Wall, in Xi'an visiting the Terra Cotta Warriors, in Shanghai experiencing the modern economy; in Tokyo touring the Imperial Palace and Meiji Shrine, interacting with Purdue alumni, and in Kyoto to see agricultural cooperatives and markets.

3 credits, no prerequisites, open to all majors

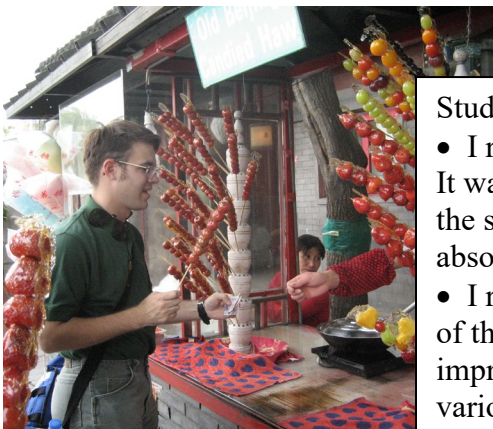
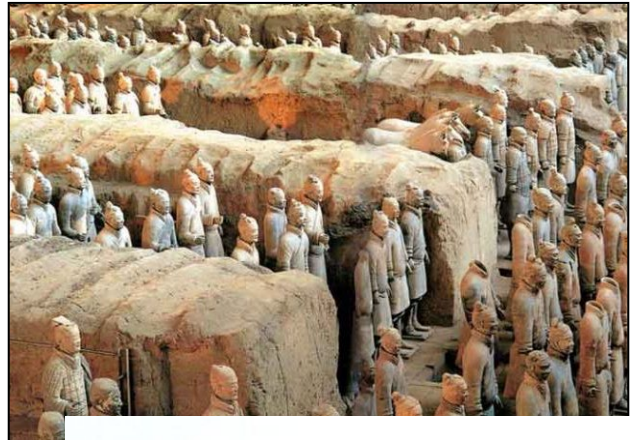
Program Fees
