

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS AVAILABLE - USGS HAWAIIAN HOARY BAT STUDIES

The USGS Pacific Island Ecosystems Research Center is looking for 1 to 2 volunteers to assist with studies of the the ecology and movements of the Hawaiian hoary bat.



Description of volunteer duties: Seeking one to two volunteers for 3 months to assist with field work and data processing for Hawaiian hoary bat studies on Hawai'i Island. Volunteer duties may include: roosting and foraging telemetry of radio-tagged bats, video monitoring of bats at roosts, insect sampling, vegetation measurements, assisting with mist netting, and maintenance of field equipment. Data entry and processing duties may include: assisting in the collection, downloading and processing of data from automated telemetry tracking stations and acoustic and video monitoring stations; assisting in the collection, management and entry of data from the field to database. Volunteer will also assist in other aspects of the research study as needed. Operates a government motor vehicle. Volunteer must have valid driver's license.

Work Location(s): Hawaii Island. Office location: Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park.

Work Schedule: Full time (40 hours per week). Highly variable work schedule including night time field work.

Service Period: 3 months (Jan – Mar 2019), with opportunity to extend

Housing and per diem provided for those that qualify. Travel expenses to Honolulu not covered.
