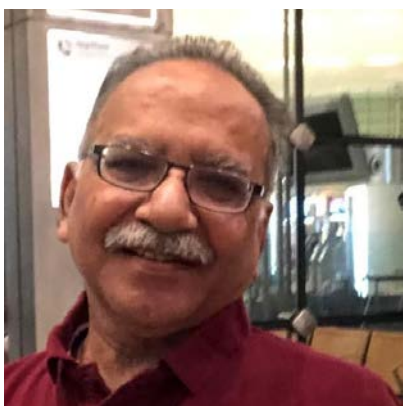
Research and Programmes to Support National Food Systems Transformation: CGIAR Multi-Stakeholder Lessons from Africa
