

## NACTA Judging Competition Results (Photos on next page)

Members of our Purdue Agronomy Crops and Soils Judging Teams (**Maddie Brink, Jason Emsweller, Josh Havron, Bradley Yunker, Josh Terrell, Anna Phillips, Ahren Berlanger, Jade Larrison, Levi Brush, Allison McCabe, Madilyn Morgan, and Kaia Wright**) wrapped up their spring NACTA (North American Colleges and Teachers of Agriculture) competition in Canyon, TX on April 12th.

As part of the trip/experience, we took an agricultural tour of west Texas, and visited a peanut processing facility, a cotton gin, and the Texas Tech agricultural research farm. The students were able to learn about peanuts, cotton, examine different pieces of equipment not common in Indiana (cotton stripper, sand fighter, etc.), and experienced the livestock and irrigation systems around the area. We also enjoyed a day at Palo Duro Canyon.

It was a very exciting competition with over 50 (2- and 4- year) universities/colleges competing; totaling over 800 college students.

Below are some of the **highlights** from the contest:

### Crops Judging Contest (141 individuals competing from 24 universities/colleges):

- **Team Place, 2nd** (this was our highest placing in the last 20 years!!!! Out of 2,400 points possible for each team, we were only 10 points away from 1st place. Iowa State University took first.)
- **Individual Overall, NOTE: Jason Emsweller captured 1st place** (a true national champion!); 6th (Maddie Brink); 10th (Josh Havron); 17th (Bradley Yunker); 26th (Ahren Berlanger); 28th (Josh Terrell)
- **Lab Practical**, 4th (Maddie Brink); 6th (Jason Emsweller); 9th(Josh Havron)
- **Agronomic Quiz**, 7th (Jason Emsweller, Maddie Brink); 12th (Bradley Yunker); 19th (Josh Terrell)
- **Identification**, 3rd (Jason Emsweller); 8th (Bradley Yunker); 11th (Maddie Brink, Ahren Berlanger, Josh Terrell); 17th (Josh Havron)
- **Math Practical**, 1st (Jason Emsweller); 7th (Josh Havron); 10th (Maddie Brink)

### Soils Judging Contest (87 individuals competing from 16 universities/colleges):

- **Team place, 8th**

Based on the student recognitions, it is quite evident that they worked/studied exceptionally hard during the last couple of years, and represented Purdue extremely well in Texas.

We am very proud of all of our students!




