Online at <u>agcounts.usda.gov</u>. Online reporting is fast and secure. You just need your unique survey code on the enclosed form to begin.



By mail or fax. Complete the questionnaire and mail it back in the prepaid envelope provided or fax it to (855) 415-3687.

Labor use the data to estimate the demand for and availability of seasonal agricultural workers. The Department of Labor uses the survey data to establish minimum wage rates for agricultural workers and assist legislators in determining labor policies. Farm labor data are also used in the formation of both farm productivity and price indices. Wage data are a component of the Prices Paid Index. Farm labor data provide information for the agricultural component of the Gross Domestic Product.

We recommend that you respond on the Respondent Portal at <u>agcounts.usda.gov</u>. On the Respondent Portal, you can complete your survey, track upcoming surveys, access data visualizations and reports of interest, link to other USDA agencies, and more.

The information you provide will be used for statistical purposes only. **In accordance with federal law, your responses will be kept confidential and will not be disclosed in identifiable form.** NASS will publish the survey data on May 21 in the *Farm Labor* report at nass.usda.gov/publications.
