WHAT YOUR PLASTIC BAG SHOULD CONTAIN

- Two Number 2 Pencils and a small pencil sharpener
- Two Artgum Erasers
- Photo Pens (three blue for marking tracts, two white for corrections, no red this year)
- Twelve Small Alcohol Prep Pads (six packs of two, to clean photo markings)
- Small Area Grid (as available)
- Half of a Mr. Clean Brand Magic Eraser Sponge

OTHER GENERAL ITEMS YOU WILL RECEIVE

- Your Interviewer Manual
- Segment Envelopes for Segments Being Prescreened (From Your Supervisor), which should contain:
 - Labeled Screener Forms
 - FSA Maps and Listings
 - CoreLogic Maps (all segments) and Listings (new segments only)
 - Labeled Ag Tract Questionnaires (after they arrive closer to June)
 - Purple Comment Sheet for Segment Record
- Segment Photographs for All Segments to be Enumerated (even those not being prescreened)
 - Will be in a separate box.
- Extra Blank Screeners (as available)
- One Blank Ag Tract Questionnaire (more will be shipped later)
- NASDA Dashboard Signs and Door Hangars (“Sorry we missed you!”)
- Segment Assignment Listings
- UPS Labels to send work to office at the end of the survey (receive from your supervisor)
