- Winter Wheat Objective Yield (OH only)
 - Sample coming soon in the office, Brooke will assign records to supervisors. Expect assignments to be pushed out in early April, sent back ~week after received
 - Packets/survey prep mid-April and shipped to enumerators
 - Mini schools late April
 - Form A data collection during first couple of weeks of May
 - Field (literally in the field!) data collection begins 5/25

Later:

- CEAP Phase I (everyone!)
 - Zoom training in late July along with shipment of screening materials to enumerators
 - Data collection begins August 1
 - Sample size will double
- Corn/Soy OY (IN/OH only)
 - No information from HQ on supply status, hopefully will get more info soon
 - Tentatively planning for mini schools to be conducted early August (right after CEAP screening!)
 - Currently office travel is severely limited, likely be supervisors training their enumerators
 - No June Area, likely will be handled similarly to WW OY, where we screen based on survey data, and randomly select fields
 - No aerial photos, will randomly pick fields

 - We will do what we can within our control to push for more in person training
- Comment office communication is vital, some feel it is a waste of time when following chain of command and prefer to reach directly out to office staff
- Communication That goes both ways, for some enumerators census of
 horticulture was marked as "mailed in" to hand estimate in the office with
 no communication about this happening, I had to call Brooke to find out
 what was happening on CAPI. So just a heads up if they are gonna take
 work away, esp at the beginning of the month with a whole month of
 collection period left, I'd like an email with communication on why. I get
 your shorthanded in the office but a little communication would have
 been nice instead of left in the dark.
- I assume no incentive money this year? (ARMS III)

- No answer yet, but not allocated yet (also not allocated at this
 point from last year, and we still had incentive pay we will follow
 up with HQ about this)
- Did get answer, we WILL have ARMS III Incentive this year!
- Maybe knowing what percent of the budget we've used would be an easy way for us (as supervisors) to gauge work left to do and time left.
 - We have spent ~35% of the ARMS III budget for the region so far
 - Data collection expenses aren't linear, they usually ramp up a lot during the beginning (training costs) the final days of data collection - so for now we will stick to the current data collection plan for ARMS III
