



Party Divisions of the House of Representatives (Republicans & Democrats: 1913 - 2025F)







election; Only 1"D" Member in a Pure Rural District from 117th.







HOUSE FARM BILL: THOUGHTS & PROCESS

- ✓ Rhetoric already calling for "bipartisan" & "on-time" bill.
- ✓ At least one-fifth of the 117th Ag Committee roster will be replaced.
- ✓ From 117th Congress House Ag Committee:
 - ✓ 30 districts considered "pure rural" or "rural-suburban mix"
 - ✓ Approx. 20 districts considered "suburban" or "purely urban"
- ✓ **Result**: Production ag & nutrition community will have to co-exist.
- ✓ R's: Navigating inner-party politics on a \$1.3 trillion bill.
- ✓ A razor-thin margin could mean just getting a bill to conference.


Party Divisions of the U.S. Senate









SENATE FARM BILL: THOUGHTS & PROCESS


- ✓ Senate: 60-vote threshold; House: simple majority (218).
- ✓ With uncertainty from the GA runoff, no Ag Committee member lost re-election. Only one retirement (Sen. Leahy).
- ✓ Historically, Democrats disciplined to vote as a block. Republicans based on geography and issue.
- ✓ Where will the money come from?
 - ✓ Cuts to Nutrition an automatic non-starter in the Senate.
 - Conservation programs authorized (w/IRA) out to 2031.
 - ✓ By default, could that leave commodities versus crop insurance?
- ✓ Will other issues creep in to 2023 Farm Bill?




U.S. Government Payments (2018 - 2027F)

CHALLENGES WITHIN THE PROCESS

- ✓ Updated CBO baseline.
 - ✓ Although prices are high now, 2023 Farm Bill will likely be scored against a lower price baseline.
 - ✓ At the discretion of the Chair, the majority of Member proposals and amendments are asked to be scored. *That takes time*...
- ✓ Budget savings & Def. reduction: A budget neutral bill may be a good outcome.
- ✓ Bipartisanship & Time: Is it possible given historically tight margins and a Presidential year upcoming? The clock will be ticking on any bipartisanship...
- ✓ Already pivoting to 2024. Senate map looks favorable for R's.
 - ✓ 3 D's represent states where Trump won in 2016 & 2020 (MT, OH, & WV); 0 R's represent states where Biden won in 2020.
 - ✓ 7 D's represent states where Biden won by single digits (AZ, WI, PA, NV, MI, MN, and ME); 2 R's represent states that Trump won by single digits (FL & TX).



FINAL THOUGHTS: 2023 FARM BILL

- ✓ Like 2018, budget situation will be difficult.
- ✓ Political situation will make it extremely difficult to get anything passed. How bad does House Ag Chairman Thompson want a bill?
- ✓ 0% chance of an on-time Farm Bill if the debate centers around cuts to Nutrition. Will House R's concede?
- ✓ Will Farm Bill get wrapped up in any sort of deficit reduction or debt ceiling debate?
- ✓ While not impossible, it will be extremely challenging to get this bill passed on time. If the Farm Bill is not complete by the first half of 2024, start thinking 2025.
